2018 Survey to the Membership continued to move the WKA forward through 2019 with management, the website, and a presence on Facebook. Kinks continue to be worked out. The WKA Board appreciates all input; keep them coming.

Regional online calendar continues to grow as a one-stop look-see for events, covering WA, OR, BC and any other PNW state wishing event advertising. WKA relies on club reps to verify their event dates by the end of the calendar year for posting on the WKA Calendar.

WKA's PayPal account is gaining more use by members renewing their membership and by new members joining. WKA's goal is to increase online use to reduce paper. The WKA absorbs all PayPal account fees.

Festival Banners for Member Use. In addition to the availability of the *Kites for Kids Kitemaking* banner, WKA acquired an *Information* banner (privately funded and

Soaring Over Suncadia kite event by Cle Elum was well attended in 2019 for the third year with WKA's assistance. Flying and kitemaking has been part of their overall activities. Suncadia's management group intends to grow this event and it is evident in their 2020 festival planning. Mark your calendar for May 23-24, two days.

Kite Day (2019) in Blaine was a trial event coordinated with their Chamber of Commerce. Held at Blaine Marine Park, it included a fun fly and kids kitemaking. Weather and turnout were good from Snohomish and Whatcom County fliers and the public. Event planning for 2020/2021 is on hold pending the Chamber's decision on field upgrades and sponsorship.

Kids Kitemaking at *Kites Over Kingston* continues to be a hit with their local community. WKA continues to be involved with this annual activity and is one of WKA's busiest activity during the year.

WKA membership banquet and raffle at the WSIKF was attended by 88 members and non-members. This banquet is a key event during the week and a major fundraising opportunity for WKA.

WKA/Tom Sisson Scholarship was awarded to Deb Young to attend in 2020. This is the 17th scholarship since its first award to attend in 2003, providing an opportunity for a WKA member to win expenses to attend. Congratulations Deb!

AKA Convention 2019 - Seaside, Oregon

As with past conventions, the WKA sponsored a piece of the **Mass Ascension pin**. The WKA piece was first in the five-piece collection that created a kite shape.



The completed mass ascension pin forms a Japanese-style Suruga kite. It is also known as a "Suruga squid kite" because of its odd five-sided shape that resembles a squid.

A **Convention Trophy** was also sponsored by the WKA for *Kitemakers Highest Score in Craftsmanship.*

Congratulations go out to several WKA members attending the convention (see below).









Chris and **Brian** took 1st and 3rd respectively in *Sky Display* with **Chris** winning *Most Innovative Kite*.






➤ Brian David didn't stop there. He won Novice Kitemaker and in Sport Kites (above) and took 3rd in Delta & Delta Derivatives (next column).
