We will experience a wide range of styles, skills, and talents in the company of many good people who have so much to offer...



From two parts of Wales, U.K., our featured presenters, Steve Brockett and Martyn Lawrence join us with two very different approaches to kitemaking. A host of other instructors from near and far (British Columbia, Washington, Oregon, California, Colorado, Hawaii...), come to share an incredibly diverse weekend of programs.



Take some classes. Fly some kites. Take a break now and then, to walk around, peek into classrooms, and see what others are doing. Talk to people you don't know. The conference once again promises to be a rich, fun and productive gathering.



Featured programs:

Steve Brockett

Internationally acclaimed artist, Steve Brockett brings a rare focus to kitemaking. Using images which evolve from folklore and mythology, he creates unusual flying forms of natural fibers painted with dyes.

Steve's workshops will introduce two groups to exploring a different way to decorate and construct images. Each participant will be painting with DEKA silk inks on cloth which will later be used in a kite. Each group will attend a morning *and* an afternoon session to allow for drying time between stages of painting. BRING: paintbrushes (better quality nylon or sable), iron, *imagination!*

On Saturday night, Steve will give a slide talk about his kites and the ideas behind the images he creates. (in theater, after supper)

Martyn Lawrence:

Martyn Lawrence designs and produces Merlin Kites, a line of high quality kites enhanced by crisp, bold surface designs. A love for fighter kites and some concentrated work with Japan's Takeshi Nishibayashi, have focused him on teaching as well as making fighters.

Martyn offers two workshops. Each participant will build a "Nishi"-style fighter out of mylar. BRING: straight edge, razor knife...

There is still time to make your plans to attend the 1995 Fort Worden Kitemaker's Conference being held March 3rd through 5th at Fort Worden State Park, Port Townsend, Washington. The fees for this year are shown in the table below. Registrations **will** be accepted at the conference, so drive on over and prepare yourself for a great weekend.

Accommodations in the dorms are modest—room, bed (no linens), common bathroom down the hall. **Bring your own bedding and towels**, in addition to warm clothing, flashlight, and other personal items.

Campsites, Officers Row houses, and other housing may be available at the Park, and can be reserved by calling the Fort Worden State Park Office at (360) 385-4730. For rooms in Port Townsend and the surrounding area, contact the Port Townsend Chamber of Commerce at (360) 385-2722.

There will be fees for materials in some classes.

Kite-building supplies will be available at Great Winds Kite Shop's Store at the conference.

The design for the 1995 pins, window stickers, and shirts was developed by Steve Brockett, and is based on one of his kites called *Dream Catcher*. Steve, a kite artist from Cardiff, Wales, United Kingdom, is one of the international guests at this year's conference. The design is shown in a black and white sketch, below. 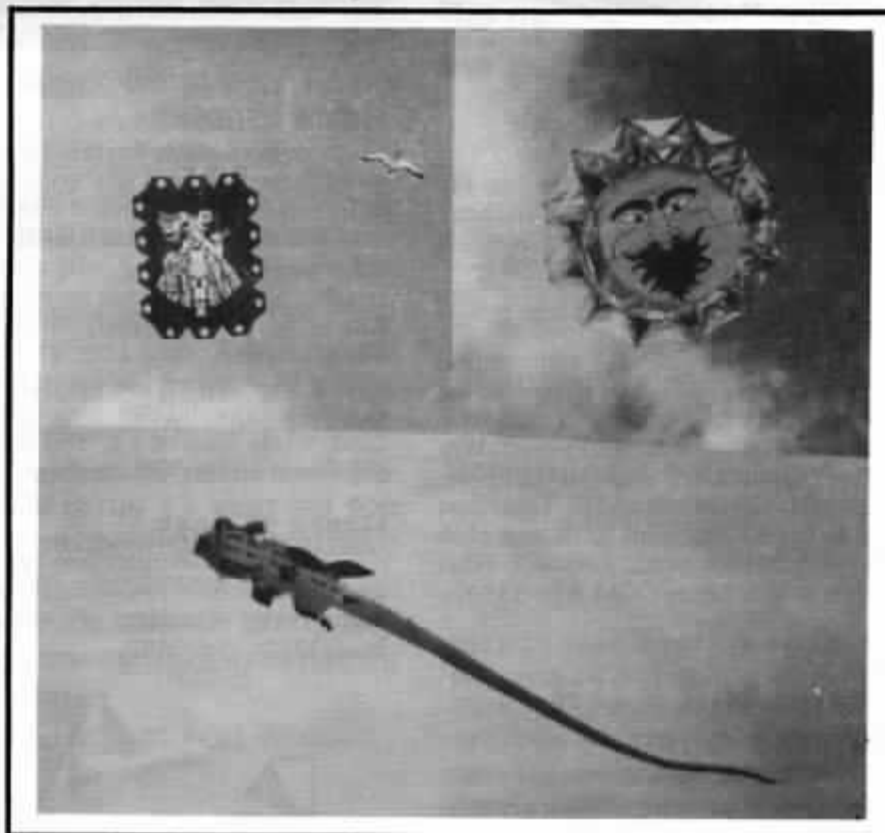
