1997 WORLD CUP VIII OF SPORT KITING TO BE HELD IN LONG BEACH, SEPT. 22-28

After seven years of growth and excitement, the World Cup Sport Kite Championship has recently been reorganized. There will be little direct impact on flyers but will leave much room for growth of the sport.

For those of you unfamiliar with the World Cup, the concept was created in 1990 by Daniel Prentice, publisher of *American Kite* magazine. The first championship was held in Seaside, Oregon, and included six teams from four countries. Subsequent competitions have been held in England, France, Japan, and Australia. As many as fourteen teams from nine countries have competed at one time.

In hopes of creating a truly international competition, Prentice appointed an advisory group of internationally recognized kite people to oversee the World Cup's direction. This committee has worked to make the competition fair and unbiased to all competitors. The committee has selected teams and head judges, and has chosen the rules and locations. Prentice continued to serve as chair of the committee.

As of August 15, 1996, Prentice transferred all rights and trademarks to the World Cup Sport Kite Championship to Ocean Kites, Inc., of Long Beach. "We now have international standards for competition, rules, and judging," states Prentice. "Most countries now have their own competitive circuit or national championships. World Cup has helped the sport develop in individual countries as well as internationally."

The new World Cup Chairman, Terry Yunker, states "We have big plans for World Cup in the future. World Cup will encompass the total realm of kiting from buggies, quads, individuals, pairs, single-line, and beyond. We are currently finalizing corporate presentations for future funding. We feel the future of kiting depends upon broad exposure to the non-kiting public worldwide."

World Cup VIII will be held September 22-28, 1997, in Long Beach. Yunker enthuses "This will be one of the greatest kite events ever held at one of the greatest locations, great wind, great staff. Everything is looking up for World Cup in the coming years...Come join us in Long Beach."

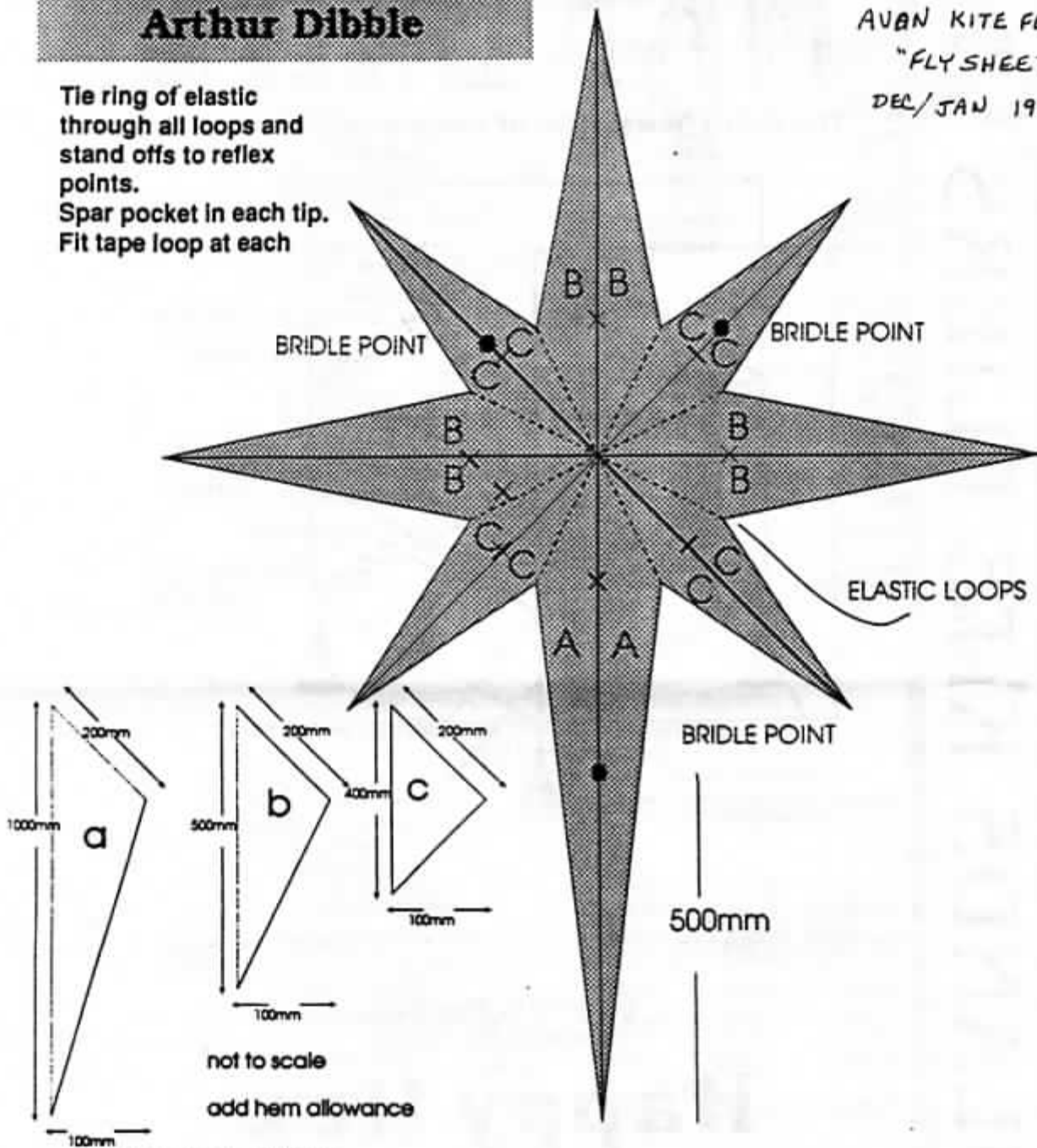

Christmas Star Arthur Dibble

Tie ring of elastic through all loops and stand offs to reflex points.
Spar pocket in each tip.
Fit tape loop at each

All dimensions in millimetres

CUT 1 of A colour 1 3 of B colour 1 4 of C colour 1 1 of A reversed colour 2 3 of B reversed colour 2
4 of C reversed colour 2

Sew the pairs together along vertical, sew resultant points together along 200mm edges to form a star. Hem all outside edges adding pockets at each tip to take spars.

Spars are 5mm dowel, spine 1500mm, spreader 1000mm and 2 x diagonals 800mm.

Tie in the centre. 1 lower bridle leg 900mm 2 upper bridle legs 600mm each.

Fly on 20kg line in a moderate wind.

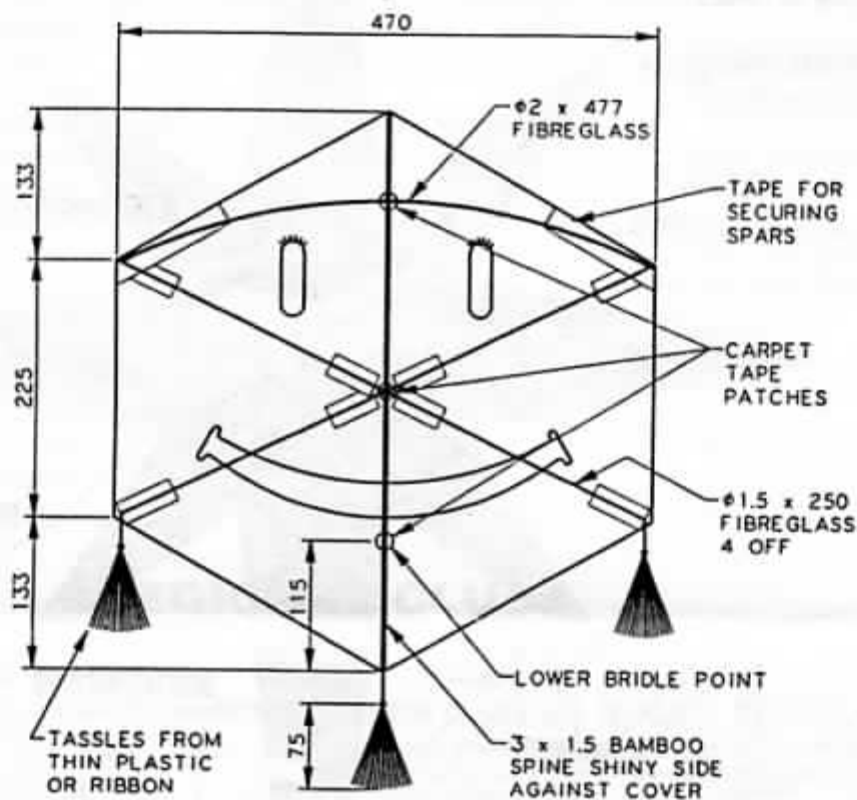

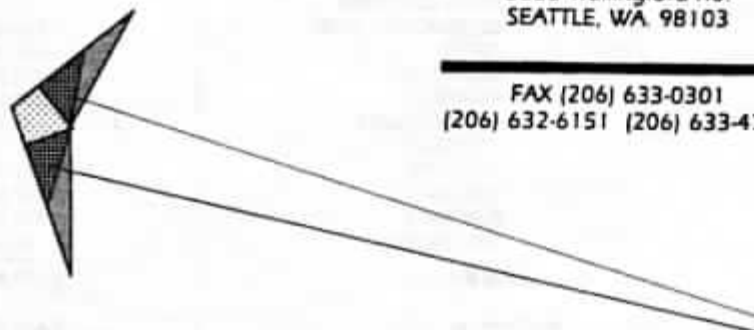

STRANGE AND UNFORTUNATE INCIDENTS

From *The Kiteflier*, the newsletter of the Kite Society of Great Britain comes the following article under the title "Deadly Kite Festival": "At least five people were killed and 150 injured in the Pakistani city of Lahore during the traditional kiteflying festival of Basant. Three young men from the same family were electrocuted when an iron bar used to catch a falling kite was touched by a high voltage electric line. One man was killed by a stray bullet from celebratory gunfire and one died after falling off a roof."

From *High Lines*, the newsletter of The Great Ouse Kite Flyers in Great Britain comes the following: "A report in the Daily Mirror told of a man who built a kite 20 ft x 6 ft that lifted him to over 20 ft. He was forced to let go and suffered injuries when he landed. He was pronounced dead on the way to the hospital in Venelles, southern France."

From the Avon Kite Fliers *Flysheet*, also in Great Britain, comes part of an article taken from a local newspaper cutting: "A girl of four died after a horrific accident involving a stunt kite flown by her six year old brother. The control line handle slipped out of his grasp and shot into Hayley Sheath's head at 70 mph, an inquest heard yesterday. A plastic spur on the handle embedded itself in her skull. Hayley died nine days later from brain injuries."

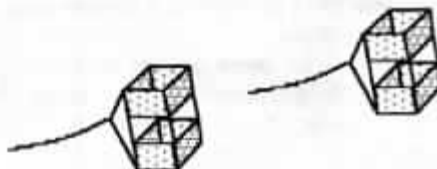
