# WHIDBEY ISLAND KITE FESTIVAL/WASHINGTON STATE SPORT KITE CHAMPIONSHIPS

September 23-24, 2000, saw a return of the Whidbey Island Kite Festival and the Washington State Sport Kite Championships to Camp Casey, in Coupeville, Washington. Now presented by the Whidbey Island Kite Fliers, in association with the Central Whidbey Chamber of Commerce, this picturesque location with mountains, water, and grass fields has long been a favorite of Northwest kite fliers.

We were blessed with two days of warmth, sunshine, and consistently fly-able winds. There was a great public turnout, with visitors estimated to be about 2,000 over the course of the weekend. There would have been more, but we ran out of parking (!)

In addition to the two-day sport-kite competition, single-line displays were presented by Sam and Anne Huston, John and Marzlee Freeman, and Mike and Kay Woodring. The skies were full of their wonderful creations, providing color and delight for all who attended.

The Northwest Fighter Kite Association also put on a small competition and did a demonstration on the main spectator field to demonstrate some of the capabilities of 'single-line sport kites.'

As part of the club's ongoing efforts to teach people about kites, we had kids' kitemaking activities both days, and we had sport-kite flying lessons. We also held a Beginners' sportkite competition, which was a great success. These fliers had some experience flying dual-line kites, but felt nowhere near ready to dive into Novice class competition. This "competition" was more of a class, held away from the menacing eyes of spectators in order to reduce the amount of stress these people were already feeling. Here was an opportunity for them to learn what goes on during a competition: how to get on and off the field, how to spot for each other, when to call 'in' and 'out', and what to aim for in flying figures. We'll be seeing some of these fliers in Novice class next year. Our thanks to Fred Marchand, field-director and instructor extraordinaire.

Another great success was our 'used kite lot', which enabled fliers with no-longer-flown sport kites to connect with other, perhaps newer, fliers who wanted a

good kite at a good price.

The sport-kite competition was well-attended, with 30 registered fliers. The Northwest Sport Kite League provided field/sound equipment and scorekeeping services; Robin Haas did the announcing; and Al Councilman served as field director. Something we did that was a big hit was that, during 'down times' between competition events, fliers did ballet demonstrations, which was entertainment for the crowd, and great for the fliers to be able to fly for the crowd just for fun.

We also had a wonderful raffle tent. Linda Barnes did a magnificent job coordinating with kite shops and manufacturers, and we had an amazing assortment of raffle items. Along with the logo-kite raffle (a one-of-a-kind Pizazz donated by Dick Barnes), the raffle brought enough revenue to support our presenting the event again next year.

Mark your calendars for next year: we plan on presenting the event the fourth weekend in September 2001 - that's the 22nd and 23rd.

And last but not least, we'd like to thank whoever was in charge of providing the weather!

These two counter rotating kites are officially the Nicolas Wadsworth Rotating Boxes. Instructor Charmayne Umbower

gives you two options. \*If you'd like to bring your own fabric, you will need 4 yards of 3/4 oz. Ripstop nylon (2yds for each kite). Or you can buy fabric from the kite museum at \$5 per yard. The cost of the class which includes all other necessary materials is \$16. Participants need to bring sewing machines and thread and scissors. If available, a metric straight edge, a triangle, cutting mats and cutter will keep things moving. Update: April and May workshops still have a few variables. Ron Gibian is juggling his schedule and will teach one of those dates and Dave Colbert who has a more flexible schedule will take the other date.

#### Ron Gibian Workshop--

Ron's two day workshop will produce a low aspect kite, possibly what is affectionately called a "noodle" kite or maybe one similar to the Mandrill kite seen on page 10 of the September AKA Kiting. Two things will happen when you take this class. You will add a unique kite to your collection and Ron will help you understand things so that you can create unusual kite shapes.

#### Dave Colbert Workshop--

The cellular kites that everyone covets are Dave's specialty. One that attracts oohs and aahs is the Goble Star kite. This is the kite you will complete in this class.
