Coming in January 2013 12th Annual Windless Kite Festival

The 12th Annual Windless Kite Festival will be held January 18, 19, and 20, 2013, in Long Beach Washington.

We will have something new: Friday the 18th, the gym opens at 4pm. Bring a flat kite or two to use for coloring the walls. Friday is all about setting up and some free flying time.

Saturday morning the gym will open at 8 am for more free flying time. At 11:00 we will have the first ever **Open Individual Indoor Single line Competition!** Judged with the same score sheet, rules, and format as the *Unlimited* event. An indoor competition just for the single line kites, followed by more free flying time. We'll have plenty of opportunity to let people try out this indoor flying. We love to help people get started with a quick lesson. At 2:00 we will be the main event. The **AKA Open Individual Indoor Unlimited Competition.** Last time in January 2012 we had 22 competitors, and we expect a great showing again in January 2012!

Then follows more free flying time until 5:00 pm when we head to the Kite Museum for the Italian Potluck Dinner. There will be awards and a bag raffle. Bring that special raffle item, the funds raised go toward supporting the Museum. We will also get to meet and hear from the new museum executive director, **Chelsea Libby.**

Sunday the gym will open up at 8:00 for more free flying time. At 11:00 will be the **Indoor Hot Trick Shoot-out**, immediately followed with some demos and the grand finale. After all that you'll get *even more* free flying time!

There was a new food vendor on Bolstad Street this year at the 31st annual Washington State International Kite Festival, which was held August 20-26 in Long Beach, WA. The Masonic fraternity has not been represented there in the past. I was told that many Masons attending the festival stopped by to say "Hello."

Lodges from southwest Washington joined together to provide food service to visitors at the festival and to raise money for an **Emergency Support Response Team** mobile kitchen to be used in cases of flood relief, or other emergencies in their communities. They would work side by side with Federal, State, County, City and Community Support operations. The Masons served meals from 8:00 a.m. until the evening hours each day. Their roasted corn was a favorite item of many folks.

The individual lodges had a choice of how their portion of the fund raising would be used, for instance to help support Masonic charities, scholarships, or the **Bikes for Books** project at Occident Lodge in Ilwaco, WA according to WB **Dick Rodlun**, Past Master of Occident Lodge. Lodges participating included Longview No. 263; Kelso No. 94; Centralia No. 63; Occident No. 99; Castle Rock No. 62, Woodland-Kalama No. 17; and Evergreen of Seaside, Oregon.

Barbara Hall, Ubiquitous World Kite Flyer Dies.

One of the most vibrant and enthusiastic members of our kite community died recently on 13 August, 2012 while in heart surgery for a valve replacement. She lived in the retirement community of The Villages in Orlando,

Florida where she could be found either teaching seniors how to fly kites or helping them build kites.

Barbara loved to travel. From Kathmandu to Timbuktu, she flew a kite wherever she went—to 78 countries, all 50 states, 7

continents, and several Canadian provinces. A jacket she wore covered with pins and badges to all but one of the National AKA Conventions was the focus of many a conversation.

She was an active member of the South Jersey Kite Flyers. As an annual participant in the Washington State International Kite Festival, she loved dropping her teddy bears by parachute from a kite. Her bear collection entertained many a fascinated child.

In 2004 Barbara was a founder with a group of lady friends who formed a support group called the **Lady Kiteflyers**. This group of 160 kiteflyer friends provided shared housing, transportation, plus assistance on the kite field and in kitemaking workshops.

Barbara was 82 years old, born October 29, 1929. We could all be inspired by Barbara’s high level of commitment to the world-wide kiting community. Sadly, we say good-bye and we’ll release a white kite in her memory.

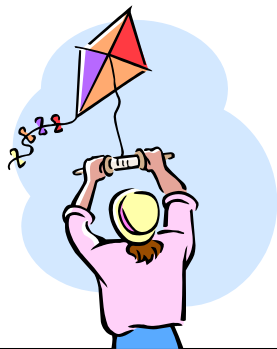
