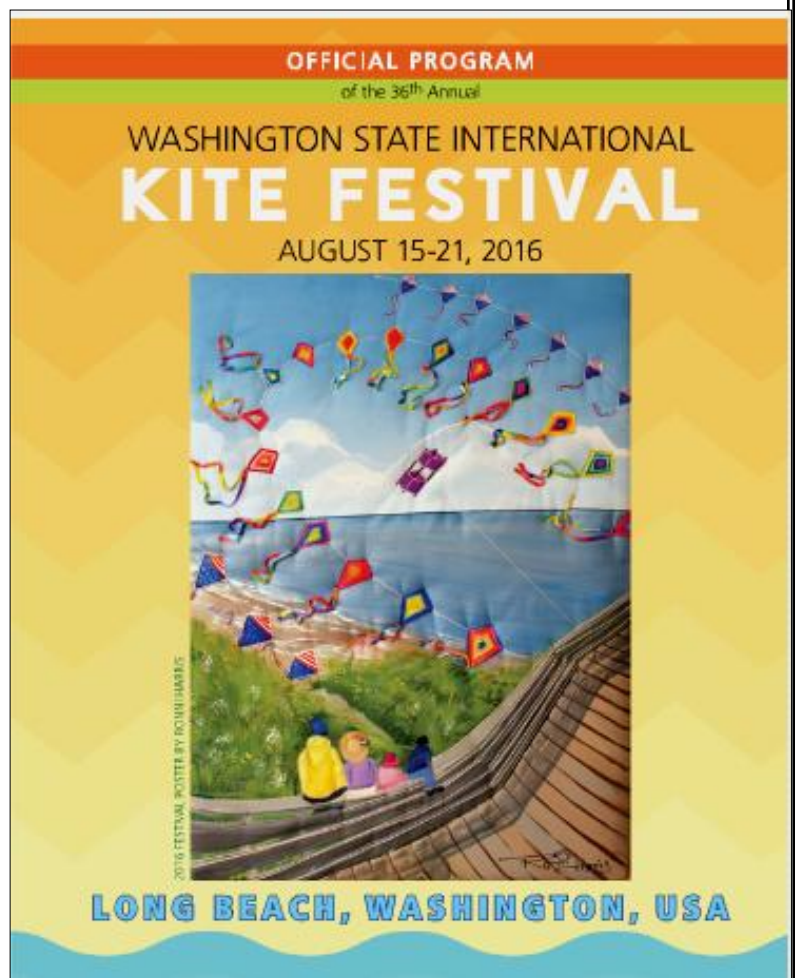

Kites for Kids at WSIKF

I think it is time for an update on the kites for kids project that is held each year at WSIKF. **Glenda Kleppin** started this event in 2002. Five years later the addition of hand sewn decorated ripstop nylon deltas was added.

The delta project would not be possible without the generous donations of many people — time, materials and money. Each kite takes approximately a yard of rip stop nylon, four sticks and a winder. And, it takes about five hours of time from cutting out to putting them in the bag— yes, each kite comes with a bag. Most of the people who donate would like to remain anonymous. However, when we receive a donation from a kite shop I feel they should receive recognition so that you, the kites, can say thank you to them and patronize them if you have the opportunity. Recently we received a generous donation of fabric from **Phil Broder**. So when you see neon green kites in the sky at WSIKF this year or years to come know that they came from **Fly Market**.

For 2016 we will be donating about 200 kites. **James and Tommy Babst** will be the on field coordinators this coming year. James has become the chief kite builder plus recruiter for this project. He will have kits available at WSIKF in case anyone wants to make deltas for 2017. If you aren't going to WSIKF contact James and he will arrange for a private lesson for you. He has recruited kite makers from California, Canada, Florida, Arizona, plus many people from the Pacific Northwest. **Brian David** made 55 this year, as he has for more than one year, special thanks to David. In February, **Pierce County Kite Flyers** members had their first annual kite making meeting night allocated to sewing deltas.

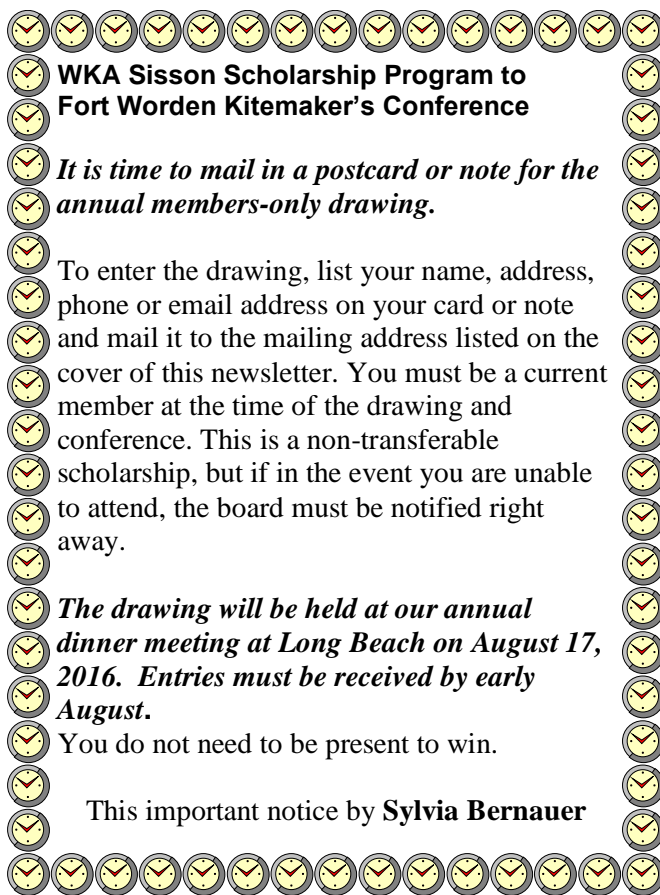
We also received a donation of winders from the **Thank You Charlie** project. If you want to know more about that project talk to **Marla Miller**.

WKA Sisson Scholarship Program to Fort Worden Kitemaker's Conference

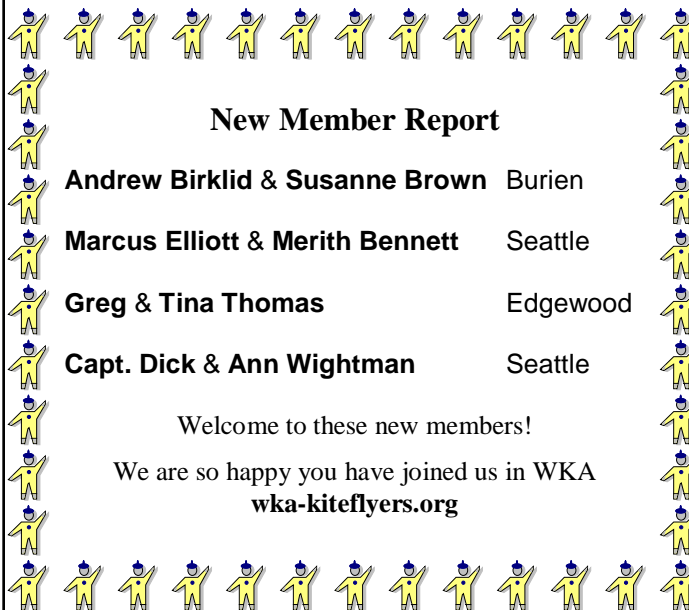
It is time to mail in a postcard or note for the annual members-only drawing.

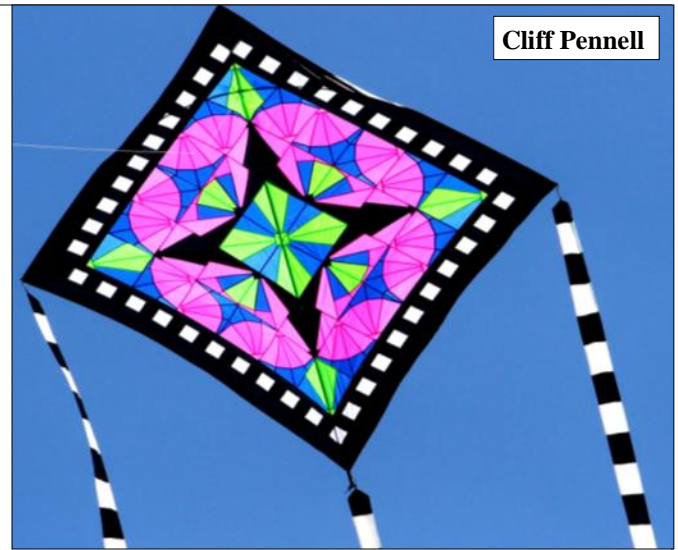
A Report on 2016 Westport Windriders Kite Festival

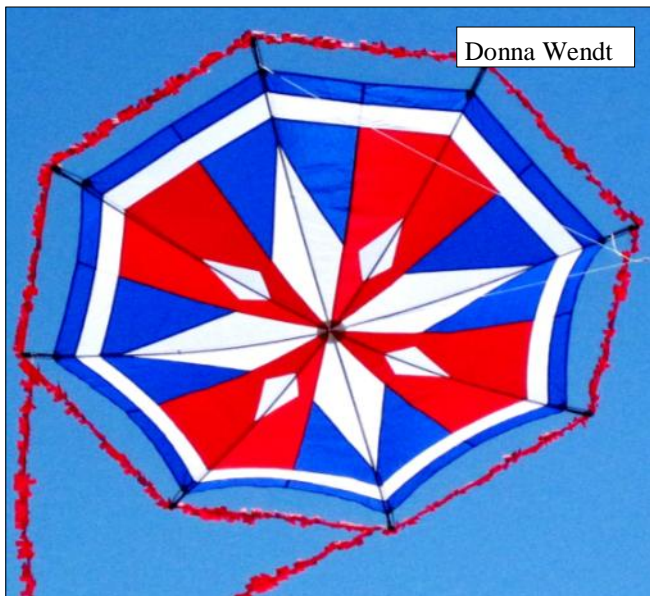

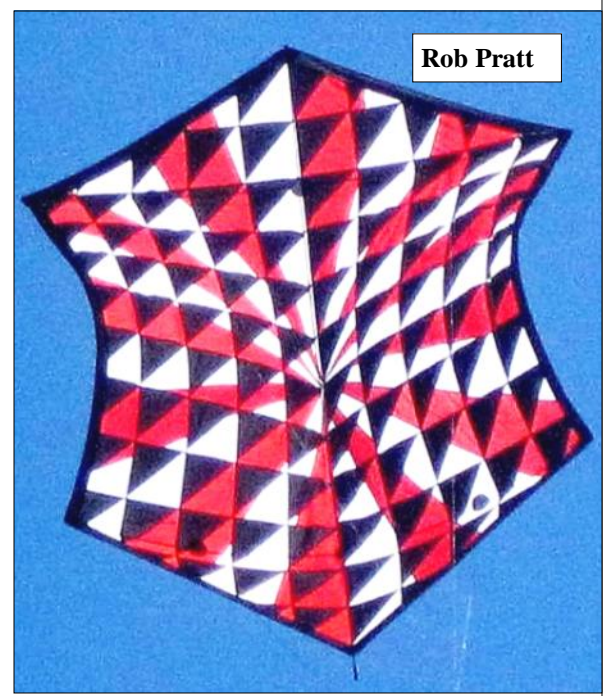

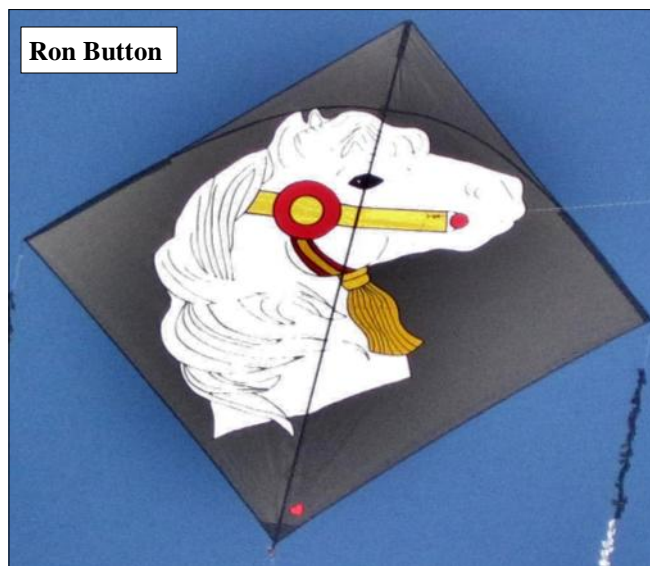

Musings of the WSIKF Fairy Godmother

To a child, the only thing more exciting than watching a parade is being in the parade. And the only thing more exciting than getting a gift (usually a stuffed animal) from the Fairy Godmother is working as her apprentice and earning your own set of wings.

Several years ago, I looked around for another way to involve kids in kite events in the hope they would want to join the kite community. It occurred to me, that since I'd already be dressed in my fairy godmother outfit for my animal give-away on Saturday, that the kids might enjoy being in the banner parade. I thought and thought as to what sort of banners the kids might be able to hold that did not require too much work on my part. Finally, I settled on giving them streamers to wave. This opened a whole new problem—what sort of streamer would 50 small children be able to wave without tangling with each other? I thought of using one inch ribbons on some sort of stick and realized I needed something smaller. I finally settled on pencils with a yard of mylar ribbon, which the kids enjoy.

I've been amazed at how well my troupe of 50 kids have behaved—staying together near me and following my directions. Some of them wear their own costumes and I provide wings for many of my helpers. Some of the same kids are showing up year after year. Hopefully some of them will decide to become an even bigger part of the kiting community as they get older. But, the kids were not satisfied with just waving streamers. On their own initiative they started putting carnival beads over the heads of the banner carriers as they walked off the field. At first only a couple of the kids did this, but—gradually more of the kids have gotten involved.

On one occasion, one of my helpers saved the day when **Dave Gombert** introduced the guest flier and stated that he would receive a key to the City. When that did not pan out, my helper rushed over and festooned the flier with beads.

The year that **Ray Bethell** was honored, we waited until the crowd around him had thinned and then my cherubs surrounded him. With a huge smile, Ray pulled one little girl up on the seat beside him. The kids may not have known exactly what was going on, but they all seemed to understand that Ray was special.

I've acquired several fairy-godmother helpers over the years. My first, and most faithful, is my loyal frog, **Jakob Knight**, who does whatever chores I need done on Saturdays. He especially likes giving things away.



I have two older apprentices who run around in wings, and several young girls who follow me back to my throne in the Fairy Godmother's tent to give out toys. Several of them have been with me for years.

I'll explain how I became the festival's fairy godmother in another article. Just know that much of what I do with the kids is still a surprise to me. It just sort of grew up around me.

The Central Whidbey Lions will again be serving chili & hot dogs, and the espresso/latte stand will have coffee and goodies.

T-shirts and sweatshirts are available for online pre-order by September 1 at www.whidbeykites.org. The Saturday dinner & field lunches (if hot dogs & chili aren't your thing) can also be ordered online by September 1. At the field, there will be a limited number of dinner tickets, and certain sizes & colors of shirts. If you want a particular color or size shirt, we highly recommend you pre-order. 
